Top Exam Tips

Here are some top exam tips from pupils who did well in their GCSEs:

- I know that everyone says it, but there is nothing better than revising. If you know it better, you are less stressed.
- The best revision for me was doing past questions – then there's hardly any surprises on the real paper.
- Don't sit there staring if you can't do a question – move on. Sometimes doing other questions helps you go back to answer the tricky one.
- There's no excuse for not answering a multiple-choice question!
- Read the question carefully, underline all the relevant words, and stick to the question as set – don't try answering something else!
- Be careful with your timings and look at what a question is worth. More marks on offer means you have to write more key facts.
- Use your common sense. If you do a calculation and it means something like a tower is 200 miles tall, then you've probably got it wrong!

Just make sure you use KEY WORDS properly.

Be Prepared—Exam Day reminders

- Make sure you know when and where your exam is taking place and what paper you are doing. There are seating plans up in the Heart, and teachers are also all sent a copy the day before.
- Aim to get to school at least 15 minutes before your exam starts, in case of any transport problems. If you are going to be late, make sure someone lets the school know. You cannot start the exam if you are too late.
- It can get hot in exam rooms in the summer, bring a bottle of water with you (and make sure it has no labels).
- Do not talk to anyone in the exam hall: it is strictly forbidden, if you need help from the invigilators, put your hand up.
- Read the front of the exam paper carefully and fill in all the boxes carefully and correctly. The invigilators will have the information you need for this. The front page will tell you how many marks there are to get in the time available.
- There will be a clock in the exam hall, which will be correct. Use it to keep track of time and plan your answers. (You can't wear a watch).
- Take some deep breathes before your exam to help you relax.

Autumn Mock exams run from 18th to 29th November 2019

BTEC Exams - 3rd to 7th February 2020

Easter Mock exams run from 2nd to 13th March 2020

Summer GCSE/BTEC exams run from 29th April to 24th June 2020.
