	Word	Definition
	phrasing	the manner <b>in</b> which a musician shapes a sequence of notes <b>in</b> a passage of <b>music</b>
	interpretation	how a performer will present the material to the listeners and how emotions are communicated through the performance
	monophonic	Solo melody / voice without any accompaniment
	homophonic	one sound or line of melody at a time that is played by multiple instruments at the same time – can be chords
	polyphonic	Different lines of music weaving together, can be contrapuntal, counterpoint
	timbre	<b>timbre</b> is what makes a particular <b>musical</b> sound have a different sound from another
	tone colour	<b>Tone colour</b> , also known as timbre, is the quality of a sound
	texture	<b>texture</b> is how the melodic, rhythmic, and harmonic materials are combined in a composition, thus determining the overall quality of the sound in a piece
	structure	means the way the piece is built
	instrumentation	the instruments that a piece has been written for
	aesthetic	<b>meaning</b> sensory perception

	Word	Definition
	discrimination	recognition and understanding of the difference between one thing and another
	inspiration	the process of being mentally stimulated to do or feel something, especially to do something creative
	discordant	dissonance refers to <b>discordant</b> sounds or a lack of harmony in <b>music</b>
	harmony	<b>harmony</b> is when you have multiple pitches being played at the same time
	chordal	a form of music in which a single melody is accompanied by sets of chords, rather than a competing counter melody
	effect	a change which is a result or consequence of an action or other cause
